The Community Superbowl aims to add fun, connectivity, and dignity to as many as possible if only for one day.

:: Description

Partnering with local shelters, we provide a fun, inclusive and high quality party leading up to the Superbowl. Depending on the year, we go directly to participating shelters or bring the shelter residents to the church.





In 2022, 50+ vendors, resource tables and other offerings provided: 750+ pieces of PPE; 1800+ diapers and swaddles; 30+ haircuts; 400 popcorn and cotton candy bags; 781+ ice cream cones; 1000+ backpacks and school supplies; 650+ restaurant donated small bites; 900+ full grocery bags; 900+ bags of fresh produce; 1,800+ burgers and hot dogs; and tons of vital testing, resources, literature and information.

:: Description

The Hope for Harlem annual block party provides vital free supplies and resources to the Harlem community, as well as an opportunity to gather, celebrate and connect to their neighbors. Individuals, CBOs, unions, businesses, churches, and organizations to gather and connect.





Thanks to the generosity of our community partners and contributors, Coats for Care was able to distribute 1000 winter coats and 1000 winter kits, and PPE supplies to those in need for January 2022, and an additional 700 in November 2022.

:: Description

Now in its third year, Coats for Care's mission is to provide the most vital supplies to keep warm ahead of the winter months. We provide coats for toddlers through adults. We also give away winter kits and socks, the most requested item in shelters. gloves and toiletries.







Black mothers are among the most undertreated group for depression. Black women have the highest level of hypertension.

We are happy to introduce a bit of self-care and appreciation to the moms of our community.

:: Description

Hosted the week before Mother's Day, this event puts mothers at the forefront by celebrating all that they do. Held at FCBC, mothers are pampered. We cater food and serve them, provide spa like treatments, give out swag bags and even have a Kidz Korner for mothers who need to bring their little ones along.






Statistically, fathers receive precious little support and programs, with 78% of parenting support programs being geared towards moms. This outreach program aims to connect dads with as much love, support, and appreciation that is showered on moms.

:: Description

Hosted the week before Father's Day, this event puts fathers at the forefront by celebrating all that they do. Held at FCBC, fathers are served dinner, given swag bags, activities and games with their kids, and even free haircuts.





1 in 4 or more than 462,000 children in New York Clty are experiencing food insecurity -- a 46% increase over pre-pandemic figures.

:: Description

Breakfast Before Books began in 2012 as a way to combat food insecurity. When children are hungry, they have a harder time focusing in school. During the school year, we provide grab and go breakfast to Harlem students consisting of items like: cereal. milk, fresh fruit, yogurt, juice and cheese.





Nearly 1.5 million New Yorkers now experience food insecurity, including one in four children, according to a 2021 analysis by Feeding America.

Annually, our weekly food pantry serves 7878 children; 20419 adults; and 10789 seniors

:: Description

For 20+ years, FCBC has operated their food pantry. During the pandemic, it was one of the few that remained open in New York City. Every Friday, volunteers pack grocery bags of meat, fresh produce and other staples for hundreds of people who travel from all five boroughs. There is also a delivery service for homebound seniors.
